



A Double Ceremony for Andy Fox

In October, Chertsey Abbey Council of Royal & Select Masters and Runnymede Council of the Allied Masonic Degrees met on the same afternoon at Surbiton.



A ballot was taken for Brother Andy Fox as a Candidate for Admission. This proved in his favour and Brother Andy was admitted to the Degree of St Lawrence the Martyr by W.Bro. Derek Williamson and the Officers of the Council.



The afternoon started off with a meeting of the Chertsey Abbey Council of Royal & Select Masters No. 254. After the Council was opened by the Acting Thrice Illustrious Master, R.III.Comp Mik Barnes, he invited V.III.Comp. Michael Flint, to take the Chair to admit as a Select Master Brother Andy Fox.

After changing into our Allied Masonic Degrees regalia, we re-entered the Temple for the meeting of Runnymede AMD Council No. 191. A Degree of St. Lawrence the Martyr was opened by W.Bro. Chris Lewis, who welcomed the Provincial Officers present.



W.Bro. Chris Eley presented Bro. Andy with an AMD napkin, pen and tri-fold leaflet on behalf of our District Grand Prefect telling him he now must get a candidate into Runnymede Council.

The next item on the agenda was to Install Brother Emmannel O Ogunseye-Babejide as Worshipful Master for the ensuing year. The ceremony of installation was conducted by W.Bro. Chris Lewis.

After the Council was closed the Companions of Chertsey Abbey Council and the Brethren of Runnymede Council and their guests sat down to a most enjoyable festive board at the Surbiton Masonic Hall.

John French, who was welcomed in due form by the Immediate Past Master and acting Worshipful Master, W.Bro. Graham Rawlinson.

Bro. William Barr was elected as Master for the forthcoming year, while W.Bro. Graham Beer was elected as Treasurer, allowing the long-suffering incumbent, V.W.Bro. Lionel Mee a well-deserved retirement.

The other candidate, Gary Raggett, and I were then asked to leave the Council. A Lodge of Grand Tilers of Solomon was then opened.
